The Zellige tile collection from Villa Lagoon Tile brings a rustic charm to any project. Unlike machined tile, these exquisite Zellige and Bejmat tiles are crafted entirely by hand in a time-honored method of tile-making designed to celebrate the natural beauty of the clay.

Tradition.


Skilled artisans in Fez, Morocco use local clays fired in kilns fueled by olive pits to create these tiles, which are then finished with an enamel glaze. The production of glazed clay tiles in Morocco dates back over 1,000 years. Having imbued a sense of luxury and artistry in homes, religious buildings, and other public spaces, the style is enjoying a resurgence of interest in this millennium. Because Villa Lagoon Tile Zellige tiles are molded, cut, and glazed by hand, each tile is unique with variations in color, edging and shape. 
















Installation Tips & Guidance

HIRE A PROFESSIONAL

Your new tile was skillfully handcrafted by our artisans and we encourage our clients to consult a skilled tile setter for the installation.



Zellige Installation

THE BASICS

1. PREP THE SURFACE

Ensure the surface to be tiled is clean and level.



2. PULL TILES FROM DIFFERENT BOXES

To work with the variation from tile to tile and box to box, it is a good idea to pull out tiles from several boxes and mix them to



achieve a good, balanced overall appearance.
3. USE A FLEXIBLE ADHESIVE

Use a flexible, high-bond adhesive or mortar to set the tiles. It is a good idea to apply adhesive to both the back of the tiles and the surface to be

4. SET THE TILES

Set the tiles as closely together as possible with little to no gap.

Do not use spacers. Because they are handmade, there will be some edge irregularities, so small gaps here and there are acceptable and can be filled with grout in a later step. As you lay the tiles, level them by hand trying to keep an average level.



5. CUT AS NEEDED

The tiles can be easily cut, if needed, using a standard wet tile saw with a diamond-tipped blade.



6. GROUT

please refer to the manufacturers recommendations.

After the tiles have been set, use a soft grout float to spread the grout over the tiles and be sure to fill the spaces between tiles fully. We recommend a flexible liquid grout. After 20-30 minutes, the excess grout can be wiped off with a damp sponge or cloth,

Can I use Zellige in showers, pools, and fountains?

Zellige can be used for all wet areas with proper installation.

We recommend using smaller tiles like our 2" mat and/or larger grout lines in slippery areas like shower floors for added traction.

Is Zellige easy to cut?

Yes, with a standard wet saw.

Do they need to be sealed?

Glazed Zellige doesn't need to be sealed but our series of unglazed tiles will require a penetrating sealant such as FilaFob.

Can I use Zellige on the floor?

For floor applications, we recommend our Bejmat tile over Zellige because it has a thicker clay body and color layer. Standard glazed Zellige is only suitable for very light traffic.

Is it suitable for outdoor use?

Yes, with proper installation.

Zellige Q&A

What kind of grout do I need?

Standard grout is suitable for most applications.

What kind of spacing should it have?

Zellige tiles are traditionally set with a groutless look, by using a butt-joint and filling in cracks with a liquidy thin grout.

What color grout should I use?

We recommend matching the grout color to the tile, you can tint it if needed. Contrasting grout may accentuate natural tile crazing and chips.

Why is zellige expensive?

Each piece of zellige has come a long distance and is crafted by the hands of a Moroccan artisan. The process is seasonal, relying on the long sunny summer days to dry the clay so production can be limited. In an effort to provide fair trade and support an ancient craft, our tile is priced higher than those that come from a machine in a factory.
